Oregon Township encourages our residents, and any agent working on their behalf, to visit our website, designed to provide as much Township information as possible. We will update our website continually, keeping Township information as current as possible. The website provides information regarding Township hours, public notices, meetings, tax information, burn permit information and election information and provides the ability to download many Township forms and other information that can be helpful. Road Work in the Township - The Township Board continues to work closely with the Road Commission in an effort to improve roads within our Township. Two major road projects were completed during our last fiscal year, (1) being the completion of the final one-mile stretch of Oregon Road between Elba Road and Washburn Road and (2) the over-lay of Bronson Lake Road between Gray and Klam/Marathon Roads, which extended northerly on Marathon Road to repair dangerous "dips" in that portion of the road. The Township is in the process of determining the road goals for our 2024-2025 fiscal year. Several roads are being considered and prioritized in an attempt to accomplish as many projects as possible. Some of those projects may include Carpenter Road, German Road, various gravel roads, etc. The Township works with the Road Commission using a tool referred to as an "Assets Management" plan wherein both the Township and Road Commission have a visual document to track and strategize for the most urgent road projects. The "Assets Management" map is available for review on the RC website as well as in our Township offices. Also, visit our website, under the Public Notices tab, for the "Lapeer County Road Commission Fact Sheet" to learn and understand the many aspects of our Lapeer County public road system.

Burn Permit and Emergency Information: Burn Permits - Please remember that your 2023 annual burn permit expired on December 31, 2023. Both the Lapeer City Fire Department and the Marathon Area Fire Authority will continue to issue an annual burn permit for 2024 which will be effective from the date you request your burn permit through December 31, 2024. Burn permits will be issued online or by phone. There is no charge for a burn permit. Any burning without a burn permit is an unauthorized burn and may be subject to a penalty. Penalties when ordinance is violated: \$250.00 for first violation, \$500.00 for the second and \$1000.00 for any violation thereafter. Violations: Visit our website at oregontownship.org under the "Public Safety" tab for violation details.

\*ICE Program - ICE stands for "in case of emergency". By creating an ICE entry in your cell phone "contacts", if there is an emergency, the police or EMS can immediately reach your family. You can add more than one ICE contact. For example: ICE 2, ICE-Wife or ICE-Husband.

\*Tax and Assessing Information - Tax and assessing information is available on our website. This information is free for your property. You will be required to create a log on and password, then you may view or print your information.

\*Credit Card Payments - The Township accepts credit/debit card online or in the office for property taxes. There is a 3% convenience fee.

\*Property Inspections - To request a property inspection while you are away from home or to speak with a deputy, contact Central Dispatch at 667-0292 anytime.

\*Storm Assistance—Please call Central Dispatch at 667-0292 to report needs ie: warming shelters, food and water.

\*Hall Rentals - Rental of the Township Hall is \$200 + \$100 refundable deposit and is available to Township residents only.

\*Lions Club Glasses and Hearing Aid Box—is located in the lobby at the Township Hall, if you would like to donate used items.

\*Drop Boxes - Drive –up white drop box located in front of the Township Hall and wall drop box located near front entrance doors for dropping off items after hours.

\*Recycling - Recycling is held at North Lapeer Recycling in Deerfield Township, please call 793-7557 for time and cost. You can check with your disposal company for curbside recycling costs. Rick Rhein Disposal offers curbside recycling to its customers at an additional cost.
